GP COLLECTIVE ACTION -A MESSAGE FROM THE PPG

The Local Medical Committee has raised key issues which GPs are facing and with the BMA have agreed collective actions which Albany and other Practices will follow.

The guidance will ensure that Practices will deliver safe practice within the financial constraints they face.

The aim is not to affect their patients. The key message is that 'GPs are on our side.'

The BMA state that General Practice is collapsing across England with each Practice struggling to keep its doors open. The action is about the survival of the GP profession as we know it. Albany is paid 30p per patient per day which is £107.57 per year, less than the cost of a TV licence.

The contract uplift this year is 1.9% further erosion of 6.6%. Albany needs 10.7% to stand still.


GPs deserve a bigger slice of NHS funding.

Inflation has driven costs of utilities up (Albany has a unique building challenge in relation to costs) medications, consumables & workforce/labour.

The Practice will stop all unfunded work which will include not signing up to data sharing, not inputting data to this, stop all pro bono work for secondary care and in relation to Safe Working Guidance will work towards 25 contacts a day per GP. Messages will appear on SystmConnect and Facebook on days of peak demand when this limit may be exceeded.
